The Childcare Choices website brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare.

As a reminder, If you are a working family with a 3 or 4 year old, you may be eligible to claim a 30 hour funding code. Currently, we are able to offer your child a free full-time place in school, however, if you are eligible for a 30 hour funding code, school will be able to claim the additional funding to further benefit the children in our care.

To ensure your code does not expire, it will be necessary to reconfirm your details every 3 months through your childcare account via the childcare choices websites.
